

DAY TRIPS

Everglades National Park

Biscayne National Park

If the Everglades are too wild for your tastes, perhaps you should take a day trip to the Biscayne National Park, which consists of 300 square miles of water, islands, and reef. Tours of the park often involve kayaking, canoeing, or glass-bottom boat. Snorkeling here is unmatched. Be sure to visit Boca Chita and its 65' ornamental lighthouse, which remains a symbol for the park. From the top of the lighthouse, you'll have picturesque views of the Miami Beach skyline.

Florida Keys

Miami visitors should definitely take a day trip to the nearby Florida Keys. The chain consists of 1700 islands jutting off the tip of Florida, but the largest ones are connected by one long road, a fabulous coral reef, and about nothing else. Each of these islands has its own unique traits.

Orlando Theme Parks

Orlando is home to numerous theme parks and choosing just the right one may seem daunting. Walt Disney World, of course, is a popular choice, but there is also Universal, SeaWorld, and numerous water parks here.

Walt Disney World consists of Magic Kingdom, Epcot, Hollywood Studios, and Animal Kingdom theme parks. Typhoon Lagoon and Blizzard Beach are the two water parks. Universal Orlando offers two theme parks, Universal Studios and Islands of Adventure, along with three resorts, a fun restaurant, and a nightlife district known as CityWalk.

SeaWorld has animal shows, performances, and audience interaction with the park animals. Aquatica is SeaWorld's sister park – a waterpark.

Discovery Cove offers a private beach, lazy river, bird aviary, and dolphin encounter for only a limited number of daily guests.
